

This event was organized by the Literature Program at Duke University, where Fred taught from 1985 to 2024, and where he chaired the department from 1985 to 2003.

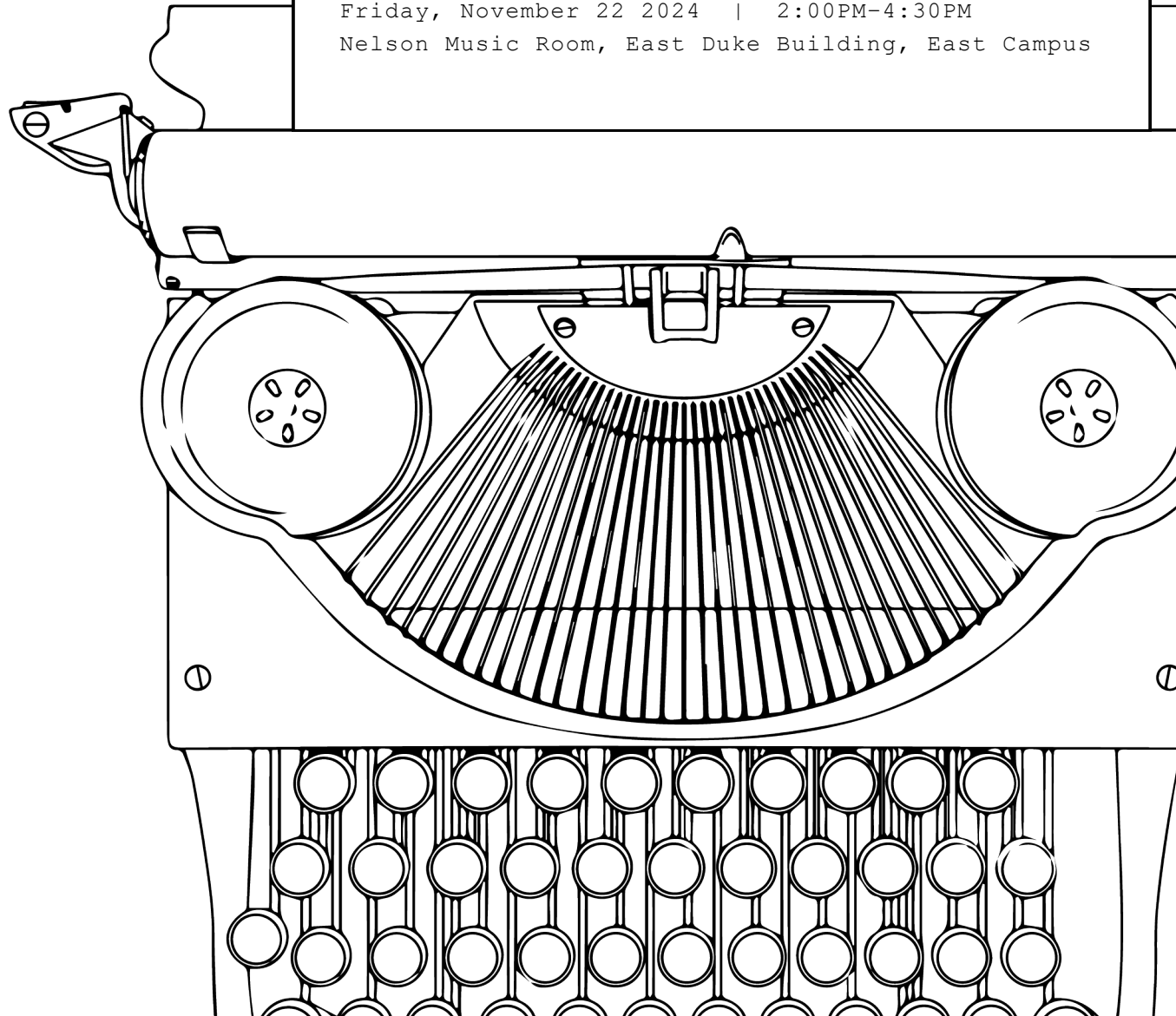

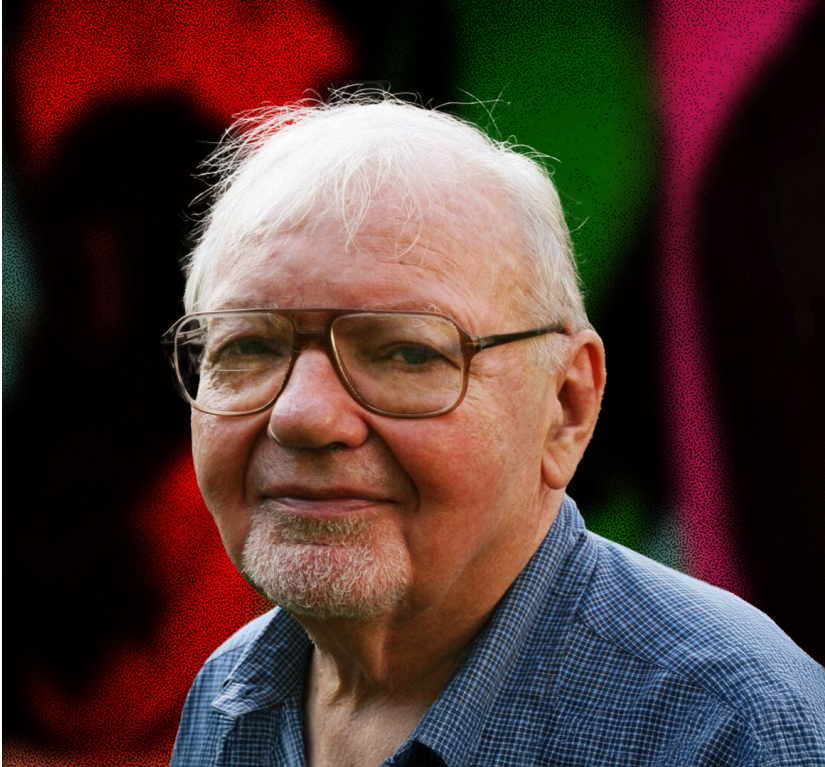
